Call to Worship Matthew 2:1-12

In the time of King Herod, after Jesus was born in Bethlehem of Judea, wise men from the East came to Jerusalem, asking, "Where is the child who has been born king of the Jews? For we observed his star at its rising, and have come to pay him homage." When King Herod heard this, he was frightened, and all Jerusalem with him; and calling together all the chief priests and scribes of the people, he inquired of them where the Messiah was to be born. They told him, "In Bethlehem of Judea; for so it has been written by the prophet: 'And you, Bethlehem, in the land of Judah, are by no means least among the rulers of Judah; for from you shall come a ruler who is to shepherd my people Israel.'" Then Herod secretly called for the wise men and learned from them the exact time when the star had appeared. Then he sent them to Bethlehem, saying, "Go and search diligently for the child; and when you have found him, bring me word so that I may also go and pay him homage." When they had heard the king, they set out; and there, ahead of them, went the star that they had seen at its rising, until it stopped over the place where the child was. When they saw that the star had stopped, they were overwhelmed with joy. On entering the house, they saw the child with Mary, his mother; and they knelt down and paid him homage. Then, opening their treasure chests, they offered him gifts of gold, frankincense, and myrrh. And having been warned in a dream not to return to Herod, they left for their own country by another road.

A TAKE - HOME EPIPHANY BIESSING

The Church has a custom of blessing homes at Epiphany and the weeks following.

Family and friends gather to ask God's blessing on their homes and those who live in or visit the home. It is an invitation for Jesus to be a daily guest in our home, our comings and goings, our conversations, our work and play, our joys and sorrows.

A traditional way of doing this is to use chalk blessed during the liturgy for the Feast of Epiphany and write the following above the home's entryway:

$$20 + C + M + B + 23$$

The letters C, M, B abbreviate the Latin words Christus mansionem benedicat; "May Christ bless the house."

The "+" signs represent the cross and 2023 is the year.

You may choose to chalk your own door or porch steps in this way, using the following (or a similar) blessing!

May God the Father, who led the Wise Men by a star to find the Christ, lead us on our pilgrimage. May God the Son, who transformed the ordinary into the extraordinary make of us a new creation.

May God the Holy Spirit fill us with love, light and true joy. and may the presence and blessing of God Almighty, Father, Son and Holy Spirit, be with us and those we love and pray for, today and always.

Amen.
