



Creation Care Team



The Creation Care group at Normandale shares in the ELCA mission to be better stewards and co-creators of the Earth by identifying opportunities for our congregation to support, participate in, increase efficiencies and sustainability as we pursue wholeness for creation. In the last several months, the group successfully applied for and received a generous grant from Hennepin County that supplied our church with organic and recycling bins, labels, training, etc. to help Normandale better manage our waste practices and reduce unnecessary costs of waste contamination. In addition to eliminating waste contamination fees, the church has an opportunity to save by increasing the amount we recycle and compost, which are taxed at a lower rate and avoids trash overage fees.
